1. INTRODUCTIONS

Subcommittee members, agency staff, and the general public introduced themselves to one another.

2. SUBCOMMITTEE DISCUSSION OF FINANCE AND GOVERNANCE ISSUES AFFECTING THE TRANSPORT 2020 PROJECT

Co-Chair Michael Blaska welcomed Subcommittee members to the meeting. Co-Chair Dick Wagner said that the main purpose of the meeting would be to go through an exercise to rate the desirability of various Transport 2020 financing options. He distributed a blank copy of a table that was to be used to conduct a "consumer reports"-type exercise.

The exercise to rate financing options used criteria such as relation to service, equity for region, administrative reality, functional w/governance part, progressivity, public acceptance and timing (need for Legislative changes. The financing options discussed included sales tax (County), sales tax (MPO), property tax (County), property tax (MPO), wheel tax (County), wheel tax (MPO), local income tax, employer payroll tax, motor fuel tax, room tax and auto rental tax.

After the Subcommittee went through the rating exercise, Wagner summarized that the options most desirable and would warrant further exploration included county sales tax, a combination of county sales tax and county wheel tax (and possibly some auto rental tax), and possibly a county motor fuel tax. Scott McDonell said that property tax levy limits are a problem, although caps can be exceeded by referendum. Dick Wagner said that we should assume that all new sources of revenue for Transport 2020 would require a referendum.

Wagner also said that the next steps should be a review and evaluation of various governance options in Dane County, and the processes that took place to get to agreement. He said that regional governance examples included Monona Terrace, the 911 services, Dane County Regional Airport, Overture Arts District and the Lakes and Watershed Commission. Wagner also pointed out that, at this point in the evaluation, we should be thinking of the financing options as potentially funding "transportation system improvements", and not just public transit improvements. The Subcommittee agreed.

The Subcommittee also agreed that there should be some exploration of what other regions in Wisconsin are doing in terms of regional finance. Michael Blaska said that there is some current legislation being worked on that allows regional transportation authorities to be formed. He also said that a Legislative Council study might be considered. Scott McDonell recalled a 1996-97 study that should be reviewed. He said that Senator Risser's office had some role in that.
